 - a. Wheel lines will need moved around. Hand lines should be all on the perimeter. There is one pipe that runs east to west in the Northern section of field. It can be moved and reinstalled for irrigation as needed.

 - a. Yes

 - a. Yes
9. What does "site visits and assessments" encompass?
 - a. KCT anticipated that the contractor would need to visit the site occasionally to assess the vegetation growth/germination/ weeds on site.
10. Are additional trips to the site for observations required, outside of observations completed during implementation of mowing/spraying/seeding?

- a. No- it will be up to the contractor to plan their restoration accordingly to target the best times and methods for weed treatment to be the most effective at eradicating the invasives.

11. Will there be a “monitoring plan” necessary for this project, or will visual assessments/observations during each visit for other activities be sufficient?

- a. There is no Monitoring Plan needed other than what is required under the NRCS 315 document. KCT will need good communication on project implementation and shifts in anticipated work as we need to inform the adjacent landowner for access.
